#### ORGANIZATION HISTORY FOR JANUARY, 1945

The month of January has brought the 285th Engr Combat Bn from training in England to holding front-line defensive positions in the Duchy of Luxembourg.

Transportation from England was rough; there were too few trucks for the equipment of an Engineer Combat Battalion.

A cheery "Welcome to Sunny France" from Port Troops greeted the Engineers in Le Havre.

Red Cross workers were waiting at Le Havre with coffee and doughnuts as we started our journey by rail across France.

The fighting men of the 285th Combat Engineers admire the men of the 42nd Rec. Sq. As one Joe said it, "I mean they are tough."

Yes, we have had our first bit of combat experience. We realize what is to be done and we are learning to do it.
